






How long have you worked on farms? (Work on a farm, greenhouse or other agricultural related job)




Approximately how many people are employed where you work during peak season? (Work on a farm, greenhouse or other agricultural related job)




What best describes the type of training or education you have related to farming? (Work on a farm, greenhouse or other agricultural related job)




What type of farm do you work at? (choose all that apply) (Work on a farm, greenhouse or other agricultural related job)




How many years have you grown your own food? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




What best describes the type of training or education you have related to farming? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




If you grow food that others are eating, how much food safety training have you received? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




How many people do you regularly share food with? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




Which of the following do you have on your farm? (choose all that apply) (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




Are you familiar with the city or township ordinances for your backyard farm? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)




Would you like to expand your farm someday and sell your produce/farm products? (Backyard farmer - grow food for my family and friends)










What is the approximate annual sales? (Operate an Urban Farm business)




How much food safety training have you received? (Operate an Urban Farm business)




Have you experienced land use regulation challenges or ordinance issues? (Operate an Urban Farm business)




What best describes the type of training or education you have related to farming? (Operate an Urban Farm business)




Which of the following do you have on your farm? (choose all that apply) (Operate an Urban Farm business)




Has the area being used for farming been evaluated for contaminants or other potential environmental risks? (Operate an Urban Farm business)



Plant vegetables, weed, mulch and harvest.



What best describes the type of training or education you have related to farming? (Participate in a community garden)






If you grow food and share it with others, how much food safety training have you received? (Participate in a community garden)




Would you like to have your own farm someday and sell your produce/farm products? (Participate in a community garden)





Would you like to have your own farm someday and sell your produce/farm products? (Non-farmer but may like to start an urban farm business)










Choose below the top 5 trainings that you would like to take to expand your business knowledge: (Expand farming knowledge)




Choose below the top 5 trainings that you would like to take to expand your technical knowledge: (Expand farming knowledge)










Choose below the top 5 trainings that you would like to take to expand your technical knowledge: (Those who would like to start a farm business)




Choose below the top 5 trainings that you would like to take to start your own business: (Those who would like to start a farm business)




Would you be interested in renting or leasing any of the following land or space? (Those who would like to start a farm business)

How to teach /provide home grown food skills for our poor populations.

My interests are mostly in sustainable and, more importantly, economically accessible practices, producing dye plants, and how to best utilize my existing space before I even contemplate scaling up.

Any organized forum to bring together the farmers of all scales in K-zoo county would be great! Main benefit being resource sharing and networking for farmers to know and support one another. I do have a lot of experience farming, both growing up and as an adult.

More classes need to be available. The current classes fill up too quickly and are only available once a year.

Please provide more easily interpreted guidance on owning chickens, ducks, goats, etc I'd like to better understand how to incorporate animals into small-scale regenerative farming where you grow lettuce. All the examples come from big grain farmers, but I'd like to understand how the rotational grazing works when you're dealing with beds of vegetables that are vulnerable to pathogens from manure.

Very interested in Permaculture and Urban food forest planning and design for residential properties. Classes and consultations for those of us just getting started.

Yes. I have some ideas for community urban gardens. These could be linked with non-profit organizations such as Loaves and Fishes.

Less government is always better for the people, leave our back yard farms alone.



I think I've already made enough comments about the possibility of saving some money on food vs starting a business. Anything is possible!





Are you Hispanic/Latino or of Arab Origin? 53 responses




Which race best describes you?




Are you a veteran?




Optional: What household income bracket do you fall under?


What is your gender?








Choose below the top 5 technical trainings that are needed in Kalamazoo County to assist those interested in urban agriculture. (Input from partnering agencies)




Choose below the top 5 business trainings that are needed in Kalamazoo County to assist those interested in urban agriculture: (Input from partnering agencies)




Is there a need for urban farmers to rent or lease any of the following land or space? (Input from partnering agencies)

I think Food Safety will need several levels of training to ensure people transitioning to growing for sale are providing safe food for our community.

Most farmers want to learn from people who look like them, and when working with diverse farmers is vital to have diverse educators. It is also important to engage hoping to learn as much about urban farming from them as they will from you. This survey is a good start.

Adapting to new invasive pests, animals, plants plus weather changes and soil quality is very important, not in a theoretical sense but specific actions growers can take now!

People need to be aware of training and potential options.

Ground and soil preparation along with the timing for planting would be capacity building sessions to consider.

Mentorship programs that take students from the classroom to successful entrepreneurship would be a great asset to this effort.
